## **PE & Sport Premium 2019 to 2020**

### **Action Plan and Budget Tracking**

In this plan we will describe how we intend to use our PE & Sport Premium to develop or add to our PE and Sport activities and build capacity and capability within the school to benefit pupils joining the school in the future.

In this academic year our funding is £19500.

The five key indicators that we expect to see improvement across:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 8 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- The profile of PE and Sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

We also use the PE & Sport Premium to provide additional or enhanced swimming activities.

Also in this report we will describe how many of last year's Year Six pupils met the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
