
In our writing lessons we are studying:

The children should be very familiar with this book now.




TASK: Reread the story from start to finish or re-watch the clip above

TASK: Edit your writing. Have you used all the writing skills?

Maths:

In our maths lessons this week our focus is subtraction.
Subtraction - counting back. This is where your child learns how to use a number track to count back when solving a subtraction.

My 1 to 10 Number Track



Point to number 9 on the number track.
 If you count back three what number will you land on?

If you jump down two more.
 What number will you land on now?

How do you use this method to work out these number sentences?
 8-4= 4-2= 6-1= 10-5=

Have a go.

Play Snakes and Ladders

Subtraction - finding the difference.

How many more children are there on the back row?
 How many fewer children are there in the front row?



Use the number line to show how you would work this out by counting backwards or forwards.
 The answer is called the difference.
 Can you work out the next problem?

Comparing addition and subtraction
